# The Oxford Die-Cast launch of the two old buses in February has caused quite a lot of interest, not only from our members but from outside the Club too!

THE AEC London General 'Old Bill' and the Renault 'Transporte de Paris' have arrived and impressed.

Imagine what it must have been like sitting up front on a cold icy January morning - well Mr Thompson in his letter published in the last edition of the 'Globe' gave us a little taste of the way it was. Frozen feet, frozen ears, frozen hands, even with their Army style great coats and gauntlet-gloved hands - they were all insufficient to keep out the cold and ward off the elements. How about when it rained? Even more discomfort - with the rain lashing down in their faces, their clothes sodden - and the controls a little bit slippery to say the least,

The summer could also be uncomfortable as the driver would then be decked out in his white trench coat, expecting a pleasant 65° - to be met with cold, wet or extreme heat.

The conductors had the better deal (but less pay) because if there was room they could duck inside - but if the weather was bad and the inside full, the passengers went on top - and the clippie had to go upstairs round the exterior staircase to collect the fares.

You can almost capture the atmosphere with these superb new releases, available as launch models B1 and B2. Plus new releases for 'Kings Head', John West and Fotorama Exhibition models, which are only available to members.

The AEC (Associated Equipment Company) London
General was affectionately known as 'Old Bill'
with an open top and slatted wooden seats,
whilst the interior had long wooden bench
seats running the length of the bus on
either side.

The stairs were exposed to the elements - one wonders how ladies in long Edwardian billowing dresses managed to get up and down them safely - especially if it was a little icy. And as for comfort - none! They rattled and vibrated mostly on solid rubber tyres, along awful roads and cobbled streets, which made reading the morning news almost an impossibility.

The fender underneath was simply to clear the road of horse manure - so the back axle didn't get clogged, and

> passengers didn't step down onto something unpleasant.

Fares were 1/2d and 1d and you could

probably get round a big city quicker than you could today.

The French Renault is built on the same chassis and body - with the different front and left hand drive. These vehicles trundled round Paris at a pleasant 15-20 mph and were painted in the traditional green and white still found today.

### 'THE CIRCUS IS STILL COMING'

THE CIRCUS is still coming - but due to the unexpected amount of vans required for the Co-op deal we have postponed production and plan to launch the edition later in the year, and will be producing a range of 6 vehicles (not 4 as before) and all in a commemorative display box and, of course, at the members price of 6 for 4.

On preparing the circus range it would be an accurate description to say it captures an era long gone in travelling circuses with vehicles logo'd to acts not seen for many a year but most prevalent in the 30s.

You are in for a treat with the edition strictly limited to 6000 sets. It is planned also for these vehicles to be released on an individual basis and an edition for these is still to be decided.
