Dunkirk Anniversary Set

This beautiful commemorative set of 4 vehicles comes in its very own presentation box with a brief history leaflet incorporating the set number from its edition of just 1500 pieces.

Chevrolet

The Dunkirk evacuation was amongst the most heralded in military history. The allies were driven back to the beaches of Dunkirk with nowhere to go but into the sea.

This saw Britain at its best with the British Royal Navy and the Merchant Navy combined with the private boat clubs and owners called upon to undertake the dramatic rescue of our boys.

Over 300,000 men were to be taken off the beaches with small leisure cruisers and



privately owned cabin cruisers uplifting the valiant troops from the beaches to the larger boats and navel vessels waiting offshore!

Known as operation Dynamo, it was seen as one of the turning points of World War II with no fewer than 338,226 men plucked from the beaches by a flotilla of 22 navel ships and 800 civilian crafts of every shape and size.

Beach Marshall

The beach marshall's were responsible for assembling the long, long lines of troops waiting to be evacuated - sorting the wounded from the fit -summoning



medical attention where necessary making sure the sick were loaded first and that each small vessel was full to its maximum, as quickly and efficiently as possible.

Queen Alexandra's Imperial Nursing Service

These wonderful women who served the country in the 'Queen Alexandra's Imperial Nursing Service' stayed with the wounded and dying as long as they could. The order had come for them to escape, but they were unwilling to leave their doctors.



As they feared, when the Germans appeared, the Royal Army Medical Corps men were captured. Some of the Q.A's drove their battered ambulances towards the sea where they eventually waded out to the waiting boats. Wonderful!

HMS Wild Swan

With a compliment of 134 crew and an armament of 4 x 4.7 inch guns, 2 x parpon-poms and 2 sets of 21 inch torpedo tubes, she was amongst the finest vessels afloat. She was built in 1918/19 and returned to active service in 1939 from the reserve.

For a short vicious spell she provided supporting gunfire at Dunkirk. In 1942 she was sunk near Gibralta by a squadron of 12 Ju 88 bombers.

We anticipate this set being highly collectable and one desired from outside of the Club. The very low edition will undoubtedly increase its value quickly.

QUEEN MOTHER '100 YEARS'

A fine bonny Scottish lassie born to be Queen! This August 4th sees the wonderful Queen Mother celebrate her 100th birthday. Born when Queen Victoria was head of state as Queen of an empire stretching across the world!



The changes that have come about during this great lady's life time have no doubt been unparalleled in any other 100 years of history. The motor car – aeroplanes and then jets carrying passengers around the world in hours – space travel to the moon – unbelievable thoughts for her as a child – electric lights – telephone – fancy that – switching light on and off and talking to whoever you like on the phone, wherever and as often as you fancy.

Think of a T.V. and in colour, then the computer and of course the 'mobile' all beyond the wildest imagination.

The Queen Mum - mother to our Queen, grandmother to the future King and Great Grandmother to the next monach after that William

The Queen Mother was an institution in the second World War - when she would regularly be seen on bomb sites throughout London, steadfastly refusing to leave her home Buckingham Palace during the blitz. She said it made her feel just the same as other London families during the war and in 1940, whilst she was in the Palace, it was bombed, with the King and her narrowly escaping serious injury.

She was amongst the many thousands welcoming the returning troops evacuated from Dunkirk.

We celebrate her wonderful life with a Bullnose (Model No. 208G) showing her residence Clarence House. The edition is already being requested from outside of the Club, but no orders will be released until 3 weeks after this Globe's release, as all members orders will take precedence. The edition is 2500 pieces.

Wild Woodbines

At last, the epitome of British smoking - The 'Woody Woodbine'.

W.D. & H.O. Wills created the 'Wild Woodbine' brand in 1888 along with another brand called 'Cinderella'. The Woodbine was originally intended as a minor export brand.

The Wild Woodbine was first sold in tin sleeves of 5 followed by paper sleeves of 5. The slide packets of 10 were introduced in 1916 with the slide packet of 20 arriving in 1930. In fact, the packet of 5 was still available up until 1973 and the price was a mere one penny (old dough) till 1915, when a farthing was added to the price!

In 1920, the 5 pack soared to 2 old pennies whereupon the price held fast for almost 20 years.

Why was it called Woodbine? There are several thoughts, but probably the most held one is that it was associated with a plant of the same name.

This totally untipped cigarette was smoked by virtually every British smoker at one time or another. Edition of just 2000 CIG007 available on a 'Model A'

We've been quite busy over the last few weeks re-locating the warehouse and despatch section at the factory in Neath. We are planning to streamline the operation ensuring faster turnarounds for all orders. The full benefit of this will be seen in the coming months – watch this space.

It continues to amaze me how sharp some of our collectors are. I have been questioned several times on the New Zealand Lamb Bullnose 127G. Early versions of the model carried a different logo. The first version had the words in "Blue" on the rosette, later versions carried the words in "white", the blue variant is the rarer model. The logo was to have originally appeared on a white model, but when the body colour was changed to blue, the artwork wasn't updated. I estimate that approximately 600 of the edition was affected.

I will be appearing at Rail 2000 for anyone who wants photos and autographs.

London Transport Commemorates the last London Trolley Bus

The trolley bus (trolley) crept up silently and smoothly - very fast with just the swish of the tyres and electric overhead line.

In the early 30's the country was in



the depths of depression with both bus manufacturers and operators seeking ways to economise. The trolley filled the role!

First introduced mainly on single

deck buses in the early 20's and then to double deckers a few years later - with most fleets throughout the UK operating them. London Transport trolleys were all double

trolleys were all double decked and served the capital for at least 20 years per vehicle they were very durable with the body work and bright work shining till the end.

The trolleys marked the passing of electric traction in the greater London area. They were replaced by diesel buses. Our Routemaster (RM16) accompanied the last London Transport trolley bus from its depot in Fulwell in the early Summer of 1962.

The top message panel, whilst seeming rather bland, is reproduced as per the actual one from that London R.M. bus.

Southern Set - Mini Classics

Southern was the smallest of the four groups created by the Railways Act 1921 and had a virtual monopoly over the south of England. The Southern Railway was unique in relying on passenger traffic for three-quarters of its total receipts. The Southern Railway was heavily engaged during World War II with armed services traffic (especially during the Dunkirk evacuation and D-day landings) and suffered severely and continually from aircraft bombings. At the time of nationalisation in 1948, it became the Southern Region of British
