I hope you all had a nice Christmas and above all a healthy one!



The demand for the cigarette vehicles is increasing rapidly and we're experiencing many requests for more liveries at a time - so here we go with two superb memory joggers - 'Black Cat' and 'Kensitas'.

Both cigarettes featured were coupon collecting brands with the coupons redeemable for gifts. So you could cough your way to a cigarette lighter or such by collecting the coupons - usually 2 points value per 10 packs and 5 points value for the 20 pack.

Coupons ceased during the first World War but were reintroduced in the 1920's.

Black Cat

The distinct logo was fairly unique though 'Craven A' liked the black cat too. Perhaps you were meant to feel lucky when you puffed them!

Kensitas

"Our belief no finer Leaf." This was their message delivered by the butler with his tray, on which lay a pack of Kensitas. Available in 10's and 20's sleeve form with the gift coupons (golden brown in colour) inside. Novel silk cards were also given away with the packs before gift coupons, the most

famous being the sets released in the 30's 'Kensitas Silk Flowers'. The butlers name was 'Jenkyn' incidentally and he always presented the cigarettes, though various slogans were used over the years.

A very unusual pack sent in by a member is K4-24 cigarettes, '20 for you and 4 for your friends'. Jenkyn's message this time is 'As good as really good cigarettes can be'

The glorious island of Malta once a stronghold for the British in WWII.

Going to Malta is a trip back in time - at least as far as their public transport is concerned!

Early in the 1900's the first buses left Britain for the island – they were Thorneycrofts like 'Ol'e Bill' in our AEC range. Over the years many buses turned up from around the world for service on the island. Our set of 3 Bedford OB buses carry the destinations Zejtun - Sliema - Rabat.

Public records show that there were 60 OB's around in 1949 - now sadly this figure has reduced significantly to just one or two!

The set comes in a display pack of 3 buses - the set is No. 7.

Now British Airways – then – BEA

BEA 'British European Airways' later amalgamated with BOAC to form BA.

Routemasters were delivered to BEA between October 56 and April 67 and were in service for them until 1979. Used extensively from Central London to Heathrow.

These vehicles (strictly speaking) were forward entrance and replaced their old fleet of Regal IV buses which operated



before 1967. The 56 seater bus was able to meet the growing passenger capacity of contemporary airlines, but as shown in this picture – the luggage was sometimes conveyed in a trailer. Several of the buses were purchased by Museums up and down the country (any member know of one's whereabouts?).
