Or in our case, 'Tops off' to toast our second new release this year, the RM open top. Codes will begin with RMO - meaning Routemaster Open but carry on in the RM numbering system.

The RM open top will be our first new bus casting for almost four years and allows us to bring you a whole new host of liveries. Just think of all the beautiful seaside resorts throughout the country, along with the many sightseeing tour buses of major historic cities.

If you live in a city or town which operates open tops send us a picture and we'll consider it for further models, but don't send us Torquay because that's the subject of today's gorgeous launch model. Torquay, known as the English Riveria, boasts one of the warmest climates in the UK, and is situated in Devon and regularly runs open tops throughout the Summer.

Torquay is also the birth place of two famous characters, the first being Agatha Christie who was born in Torre parish in 1890 to an English mother and American father. She spent her younger years working in a pharmacists in Torquay and one presumes is where she gained her knowledge of poisons!

The second character was of course old 'Basil' from 'Fawlty Towers'. Discovered, or should we say manufactured by the 'Monty Python' team who were staying at 'Gleneagles Hotel' in Torquay whilst filming the T.V. series.



During there stay, the proprietor threw Eric Idle's bag out of the window mistaking it for a bomb! He also complained that one of the teams eating habits was deplorable and generally snarled and snapped at the other guests!

When the 'Monty Python' team left, John Cleese stayed on and modelled the hotelier into a character and Basil was born.

Open top buses first appeared around the early 50's and were predominantly used in

seaside resorts. They were generally older buses with the top chopped off and brought into service for the Summer. They would always travel along the promenade then often couple the journey with a mystery tour – maybe to a local historical point.

Make sure you get the first of this series they'll be coming regularly and could be a nice little collectable in it's own right or indeed as part of the RM series.

Red and Blue means du Maurier

We had Red & White and Black & White, but this time Red & Blue introduces our 2 new cigi vehicles - du Maurier came in red or blue boxes. Red meant strong strength. Blue meant medium strength.

In a way, du Maurier were quite unique. Instead of the flip top or sleeve packs favoured by most of the major brands, du Maurier presented it's cigarettes in lid type boxes of 20. Very art deco in style don't you think?

It sort of sounded nice to say one smoked du Maurier as it promoted style and class, whilst with its lid top boxes, preserved the cigis in perfect condition. Why this style of pack was not more widely used is hard to say, one can only imagine costs, as only the more expensive cigarettes were packed this way.

Manufactured by the London Tobacco firm of Peter Jackson in 1929 or rather re-launched by them in that year du Maurier cigarettes was the first to carry a filter tip and was aimed mainly at women smokers.

These two delightful models are the Model A and Bullnose

Whilst on the subject of cigis, member Mr. Richardson from Dartford tells us - "I smoked 'State Express' whilst in the Far East in 1945 - I preferred '777' from the range and paid 33 shillings per 1000". Reckon 33 shillings is around £1.60!

The 'Champion' with a cover price of 3d was a firm favourite when it first appeared in January 1922.

Again aimed at boys and similar to most comics of its day, featured coloured cover front and back with black and white inside.

In total, 1729 issues were printed until its cessation in 1955 - thirty three years later.

There was some confusion with the last publication as the centre fold told its readers to start buying 'Lion' from next week on, but other editions advised readers to get 'Tiger'.

We have no such problem however - our 'Lion' vehicle is model no. CC05 and was released a few months ago!

Back to 'Champion'. It also had a few of those familiar super heroes including 'Buckaroo Bill Hardy' who was the cowboy champ of the 'Double Diamond' ranch and the toughest guy around. His sidekicks were Tommy Turk along with Giraffe Jackson. Oh and by the way, Buckaroos horse was called 'Red Flame'! Can you believe it! Here 'Red Flame' – go 'Red Flame' oh dear! Our lovely model featured is the Chevrolet.

OMNIBUS

Isn't it a beauty! George Shilibeer gave London its first regular bus service in 1829. Not at all like today's model though!

Horse power it had but only one or two! To commemorate 150 years of 'the Shilibeer buses' anniversary a dozen Routemasters were painted in the original Shilibeer green, with every bus being sponsored by an individual advertiser.

This vehicle operated around Trafalgar Square in 1979 and was still running in the colours 10 years on.

A new Range

For some while we have been asked and requested regular military vehicles and so the first of this new series begins today.

1st Commando - The 1st Commando unit was one of many such units formed during the second world war. The shoulder flash depicts a Salamander, a mythical creature like a lizard which was able to endure fire. To wear the salamander shoulder flash symbolised your quality for endurance and danger.

The '1st Commando Force' was founded in 1940 to operate units of storm troops who could move with stealth and speed, each unit was small and consisted of just 50 men with 10 troops in all, later reduced to 6 troops of 65 men.

Battle Honours - Vaagso Dec 1941, St. Nazaira 1942, Dieppe Aug 1942, Kangaw Feb 1945.

The model is a Model TVan, Model No: MIL001 Edition: 2000

Beamish

JEUTILISTI - The first Beamish bus

This vehicle, very similar to the first, carries more advertising and is much closer to the exact vehicle running round the Beamish Museum. In fact, the advertising panel is now increased to the 4 adverts as their vehicle has on it. Our original model carried only 2.

The Old Magazines Continue - 'War Illustrated'

During World War II the publication 'War Illustrated' was published. However, during its duration through the War, its circulation and regularity of issue reduced.

Initially, it was produced weekly, but as materials became more difficult to obtain - many readers had to share the same issue. Even by doing this only helped for a short while due to restricted imports and availability of wood for pulp!

The magazine eventually became a 3 per month issue and later fortnightly.

It's articles of course related to the happenings of the War and made very interesting reading, catching the spirit of pain - courage - misery - desperation and agony, with superb pictures detailing victories and defeats.

One such article – It was on October 30th 1942, (nearly fifty years ago), that the pale gold of a full moon cast ashen over the desert as General Bernard Montgomery gave the fateful command; within the instant one thousand guns thundered into action. The Battle of El Alamein had begun. The Eighth Army infantry attacked on two fronts. Montgomery's 200,000 men included Britons, Australians, New Zealanders, Indians, Frenchmen and Greeks. By the 15th November the bells of victory were ringing, it was the first time they had been sounded since the threat of German invasion in 1940. The Eighth Army had virtually wiped out the Afrika Corps.
