
PRINCE WILLIAM

The 771 Naval Air Squadron operates Westland Sea King M5 SAR (search and rescue) helicopters and they average more than 220 missions every year. The crest of the regiment originates from the early days when the squadron flew the Sea Hornet. They've also adopted the 'ace of clubs' as a logo which is displayed on the nose and sides of the aircraft.

Often operating in extreme weather conditions and at the limits of endurance and range, thousands of people owe their lives to the outstanding feats of bravery performed as routine events by the duty crews. The squadron is on 15 minute alert status from sunrise to sunset, and 45 minutes at night time

although in most cases they are airborne in less than five minutes. A typical crew consists of two pilots, an observer, a winchman and a SAR diver. The diver is able to jump 40 feet from a hovering helicopter and free swim in the open sea. We feature the crest of the Squadron on our Bullnose.

Founded by Charles Lambert and Charles Butler - Lambert and Butler started its life in 1834 at St John St, Clerkenwell, London. A few years later they moved to Drury Lane. As well as manufacturing

cigarettes they are also specialists in pipe tobacco and cigars. Like many of the British companies they played their part in the great tobacco wars in the early 1900's. Lambert & Butler were on friendly terms with Wills and therefore it is not surprising that they were one of the 13 companies that met in the Queens Hotel in Birmingham to counter the threat of the American planned takeovers. With over 500

tobacco firms some of whom were struggling it was important that only the stronger companies were involved. We are not sure when the Waverley brand was introduced, but we have seen many of their cards dated around the 1900's. We presume the brand had some connection with Sir Walter Scott and the Waverley novels.

THE BLACK WATCH



Raised over 250 years ago with the purpose of keeping a check on wild clansman it is the oldest Highland Regiment. There are several ideas about the origins of the name, but the most probable is because of the dark tartan that they wore in contrast to the regular guardsmen who wore red. The Red Hackle was worn from the 1770's and later an order was issued giving the Black Watch the sole right to wear it, which they do to this day.

The Regiments first action was in 1745 at the Battle of Fontenoy in Flanders and it has served in almost every British Campaign since. At the outbreak of the first world war there were seven battalions which included the Territorials all of which saw action, over 8,000 members of the Regiment lost their lives during this time. In World War II the 1st Battalion, 5th (Angus) and the 7th (Fife) arrived in Africa as part of the 51st Highland Division and took part in the battle of El Alamein.

Men of the Regiment were the last to leave Hong Kong when it was handed over to China in 1997. More recently the 1st Battalion has been deployed to the Gulf and took part in the Operation Telic. During this deployment it suffered its latest casualty Lance Corporal Barry Stephen who was killed in action.

The main replacements for the Army were Players and Woodbine.





It was in the 1950's that childrens television came of age and Robin was launched as the companion to Eagle, Girl and Swift - aimed at the younger age group. In 1950 Andy Pandy had hit the screens. In the first TV episode he was alone, but soon Teddy arrived and then Looby Loo. Only 26 original episodes were made, all in black and white, a further 13 colour were added in the 1970's. The Flowerpot Men (Taff and Dusty?) were added to 'Watch with Mother' a couple of years later.

It was in response to this that Robin was issued on the 28th March 1953 and the front cover featured Andy Pandy. Along with the Flowerpot Men, other

favourites were Mr Woppit and Toyville. We believe the last issue of the comic was in January 1969 although were not entirely sure. We have seen annuals dated as late as 1974. Perhaps someone out there can help us?





Stevensons BUS SERVICES



Model No. RM058 Edition: 2,000

In Globe 42 we released the RM058 and asked for details on its history. We had many responses but felt that the one that covered the history best was the letter from Mr S. Tyreell Membership 151633. He receives a free model and certificate No 1 signed by Taff.

Stevensons are from Uttoxeter, Spath and started on 11 September 1926. The company started by John Stevenson, a farmer who at the age of 51 after struggling through difficult times decided to set up as a bus operator. In 1966, following his death at the age of 91, all his sons and daughters received shares in the business. However only George and John (junior) wanted to continue and following a public auction George took control of the business which then expanded. The Oxford model is RM699 a Routemaster originally built for Northern General. The company was sold to the Cowie Group who acquired British Bus in June 1966. It is now called Arriva serving the North Midlands.
