60th ANNIVERSARY LAND ROVER

The Land Rover was designed in 1947 as a post-war temporary stopgap measure for the export-hungry Rover Company. The enthusiasm of Rover's top management was so great that it axed plans for its new 'mini' car in favour of the 4x4 newcomer. The 4x4 from Solihull, West Midlands, exceeded all expectations and

created a world-wide niche.

The creators of the Land Rover were Spencer Wilks, then managing director of Rover, and his brother, Maurice, then engineering director. They designed the Land Rover as a civilian replacement for the US Jeep, manufactured by Willys-Overland and Ford. They chose 'Birmabright' aluminium-alloy for the body panels, as steel was still strictly rationed after the war, and all Land Rovers since have had aluminium alloy panels. The Land Rover was to be Rover's flagship export model, as at the time there were large financial incentives for companies to produce products for export. Rover thought that a 4x4 would appeal to many people, including those living in the developing colonial outposts.

The first Land Rover prototype was built in the summer of 1947, and all the early prototypes had a tractor-like centrally-mounted steering wheel. This was done to save money building separate left-and right-hand drive models for export. However, by the time the production Land Rover appeared in 1948, the centre-steer idea had been scrapped. The Land Rover range was improved and expanded over the years to meet customers (both civilian and military) demands, and to

exploit gaps in the market. Our first release is HUE166 which was the plate of the first Land Rover and is an 80inch wheelbase model. It appears in it's reconditioned form at the museum in Gaydon. In March 1967 the 'Iron and Steel Act' brought into public ownership about 90% of British Steelmaking. The country's non integrated steelmaking and rerolling companies,

including half of the specialised steel production facilities were left in the private sector with a number of small companies. In July of that year BSC (British Steel Corporation) was formed from the UK's 14 main steel producing companies. This enabled the reshaping of a vital industry after years of insufficient capital investment.

In the 1970's the Government approved a 10 year

development strategy with expenditure of £3,000 million from 1973 onwards, the objective of which was to convert BSC from a large number of small scale works using largely obsolete equipment, to a far more compact organisation with highly competitive plant. Steelmaking was to be concentrated in five main areas: South Wales, Sheffield, Scunthorpe, Teesside and Scotland.

In Globe 48 we released a Model T (DR008 -2003) for the Jim Beam Bottle Club of New Zealand and that was followed two years later by a Bedford. This is the latest version a Chevrolet truck. On the back door of this model you will find the date 2007. The birth of Bourbon dates back to the 1700's (Dusty remembers it well!), the rich flavour of Kentucky bourbon was discovered when a batch of corn whiskey was aged in new white oak barrels that had been charred by fire. In 1795 the recipe and distillation process was perfected by Jacob Beam.







The Bedford Beagle was an estate car conversion of the Bedford HA 8cwt van, which itself was based on the Vauxhall Viva HA. The conversions were undertaken by Martin Walter Ltd. Whilst the vans were very common at one time, the Beagle was altogether rarer and there are very few left today.

Introduced in 1964, originally with the 1057 cc engine, the Beagle was basic, with drum brakes all round and minimal interior trim. Later engine upgrades arrived in 1967 (1159 cc) and 1972 (1256 cc), bringing the top speed up from 72 mph (116 km/h) to about 80 mph (129 km/h), but the Beagle was finally discontinued in 1973. It was more or less replaced by the superior Viva HC estate cars.





Walls turned to ice cream production as a consequence of the phobia people had over eating pork during the summer in the early part of the 20th century. At the time home refrigeration was not widespread and pork didn't keep well during the hot weather. As a result Wall's were laying off staff with a large drop in sales - hence the switch to ice-cream.
