

The present proprietors are proud of the fact that the business still remains a family concern since its humble beginnings with a horse and cart. The fleet of vehicles has grown over the years and goes from vans to 44 tonners, the majority of which are Scania powered, handling a variety of goods from car parts to plastics. This model will be shipped at the end of April under separate cover.



LAND ROVER UPDATED VARIANT

The demand for the first release of the Land Rover, the 80 inch version was unprecedented. We sold out far more quickly than we had expected. We have produced a second uncertificated variant, with several changes and the model is coded LAN180001E. The differences are as follows. There is a thin silver line along the bottom and sides of the rear tailgate. On the chassis the axle parts are painted black. The two hinges at the back edge of

the bonnet, below windscreen are in silver as are the upright pegs each side of spare wheel. The rib along the panel below windscreen is painted in satin black.



A railway vehicle used to transport track maintenance employees to the work site, which included a combined workshop. This is modelled on a real picture we viewed of the actual vehicle. Add to this the Minor Van and you have an interesting set. This is the first variant of the TK in this form, we have a second variant with a stepped roof that will issue over the next few months which was used by the Signalling & Telegraph Engineers.

Originally intended for later this year we received such enthusiasm that we bought it forward a quarter.




The first chairman was Lord Nuffield (William Morris) but he was replaced in August 1952 by Austin's Leonard Lord

In 1888 the Eastman Dry Plate and Film Co. of Rochester, New York, introduced the Kodak. The word Kodak was made up by George Eastman as a trade mark, it soon became synonymous with this type of camera. Later the company changed its name to Eastman Kodak due to the success of the new camera.

Although the Kodak was not the first roll-film camera its immense popularity was due to the full developing and printing service that went with it. The Kodak was 6 ½ inches long and came ready loaded with film and was tied and sealed to show that it was fresh from the factory. When one

hundred pictures had been taken the camera was returned to Kodak who processed the pictures. You pulled the cord to set the shutter and pressed the button to release it. A viewfinder was not regarded as necessary. It used paper rolls to start with, but by 1889 Eastman introduced celluloid roll-film. The Kodak made photography accessible to the general public for the first time.





It looks like our old version, but don't be deceived by the picture, it's actually a smaller version - just over 2 inches long (55mm). The same model will appear in our 10th Anniversary set which will release late May (a little later than anticipated). That set features 10 liveries which are drawn from our range, going back over our history. Dusty has suggested that we could

reproduce all of the liveries that have appeared on the larger version - the thought of that is not appealing, as I think when we last counted there were in excess of 500 that had been produced. If some of you do have some old favourite liveries, then please let me know, as we will add them to a wish list that we are creating. We produced between 3 to 4 million Bullnoses, I have counted before, but I have forgotten the exact number. Some of the largest runs were on the series of Co-op models in the mid nineties which alone were over 250,000 pieces. If you have only just joined the club and want the model then it can be purchased for £2.95. TAFF
