

Robert Owen is often regarded as the father of the Co-operative movement, but the concept goes back further, when trading companies were formed to arrange the bulk purchases of cheap foodstuffs. The Co-operative Wholesale Society came into existence in 1863 in a small warehouse in Manchester. In 1873 they started to manufacture goods: biscuits, boots and shoes, soap, washing machines, corsets, bicycles etc. They later purchased tea plantations in Ceylon and butter facilities in Denmark.

Cockermouth in 1901. 16 year old Luigi Luchini leased premises from which he manufactured and sold ice cream and confectionery. He had arrived in the country from Italy four years earlier and was employed initially washing lemonade bottles, before moving on to Tognarelli's for a short period.

Luchini's were established in Market Place,

His own new business prospered, interrupted only during the 1914-1918 war when he served with the Border Regiment, during which time his wife ran the business. He had eight children and as they grew older they played an increasing part in the prosperity of the firm. Luigi and his family started

delivering ices to the surrounding district, firstly by horse drawn vehicles and later by motor. A further outlet was opened and on Luigi's retirement, Frank a son took over the running of the business. He met his death whilst serving in North Africa in 1942 and another son Ralph after demobbing from the Royal engineers in 1947, took over the business with his brother Denis and sister Evelyn. A shop was then opened in Keswick.

In 1989 the business was taken over by Ralph's son Tony, who is a member of the Oxford Diecast collectors club, which explains why we were pleased to include this model when we were deciding on a new livery. Thanks to him for all his help - TAFF



The Leeds based Company, J Long and Sons (Haulage) Ltd, has been hauling all manner of goods around the country since the days of the horse and cart. In 1918 Joe Long returned home to Holbeck in Leeds after serving in the first world war in which he had been wounded, taken prisoner and spent time in a German Hospital undergoing serious operations to save his life, resulting in him being left with only one lung. On his return he resumed his business as a coal merchant and general carrier with horse and carts and later with the first of the motor wagons. He could not have foreseen the success that lay on the long road ahead.

In the early days of the company's history, Joe carried out all the work on his own with the help of his trusty horses and carts which he kept in stables near to his home in Chetwynd Street. The business continued to grow in this manner until 1933 when it became the second firm to be registered for the sale of coal by Leeds Weights and Measures.



The Austin Low Loader model was launched in 1934, continuing on the success of the earlier, 'high lot' (due to its height) 12/4-based taxis. The roof rack is quite distinctive, and it also had a folding rear roof section. You would seen plenty of these, particularly on the streets of London at the time. You really need to look at the detail to appreciate the work that has gone into producing such a model. Rob spent a lot of time creating the master sample and it has been well worth it. So this joins the other taxi cabs in the range - the FX4 and the TX4.

Southdown Motor Services can trace its history back to a pair of steam buses which operated between Pulborough and Worthing. However the company itself was formed in 1915 abandoning plans to call itself South Coast Motor Services (a similar name had been registered by a Folkestone operator). BET took an early interest in the company as well as Thomas Tilling. The operating area of the company was bounded by Eastbourne, Portsmouth and the Sussex border. In 1921, joint services with Maidstone & District were started between

Brighton and Hawkhurst (later service 18) and Eastbourne and Hastings via Hailsham (15). Southdown also began to establish a programme of local long distance tours throughout the twenties and it was in 1921 that the famous Southdown scroll logo was adopted. Southdown pursued a policy of purchasing rival operators to consolidate its business. Companies acquired included Royal Red Coaches of Hove and Eastbourne operators Foard's, Cavendish, Southern Glideway and Chapman & Sons.

D.Di Mascios impressive fleet of ice cream vans worked the streets of Coventry and surrounding areas for more than half of the last century. Such was their influence a new word came into the local dialect; asking for a 'D. Di' can still be heard occasionally even today. The Di Maschio name is from Valvori, near Cassino in Italy. Their first premises were in King William Street around the 1930's, others opened later in Smithfield Street and Clay Lane. There are over 70 vehicles that are known to have been in the D.Di Mascio's fleet – the Anglia was the last. Thomas Henry Barton used a Durham Churchill charabanc to start the company's first service, between Long Eaton and the Nottingham Goose Fair, in October 1908. Barton was a prolific rebuilder of buses, producing both coaches and double-deckers on rebuilt chassis. Many new and secondhand buses also joined the fleet, and Barton kept up its modern double-deck image with Northern Counties-bodied AEC Regents which had wrap-around windscreens on both decks.During the 1950s Barton had over 280 vehicles and 1000 employees.

In 1864 George Barham, the son of a London dairyman, formed the Express Country Milk Supply Company at 28 Museum Street, near Kings Cross Station, in London. George was concerned about the quality of milk that he was selling, believing that London's cows were living in cramped and unhygienic conditions. He decided to transport fresh milk into London via the railway, which led to the name of the company - Express Dairies




CLASSIC & VINTAGE COMMERCIAL SHOW


